

What's an RHCC?


A partnership of agencies and health care organizations in a defined geographic area that have a stake or interest in **healthcare** emergency preparedness within the region.

What does an RHCC do? -

- Create **regional** emergency preparedness, response, and recovery plans
- Advise emergency management for regional disasters
- Distribute funding for **regional** preparedness projects.



There are 3 RHCC regions in Montana. They match the current Trauma Referral Areas.



Why have regional coalitions?


RHCCs encompass a whole community approach to strengthen and enhance the **capabilities** and **capacities** of the public health and health care systems to plan, prepare, respond, and recover from **emergencies** and **disasters**, either natural or man-made.
