Minutes Approval	April 19, 2018
Presentations	 DNRC and HDR provided an overview of the new modeling of Middle Creek Dam conducted in 2017. The 2017 work utilized much more sophisticated modeling technology with a much more detailed 2D resolution. They also utilized different scenarios than the traditional Clear Weather and Probable Maximum Flood scenarios. For 2017 both a simplified breach and overtopping scenario were utilized. The overtopping utilizes the assumption that all waterways are already at maximum capacity, the reservoir is full, then a failure. The Probable Maximum Flood scenario modeled with all waterways empty before the failure, so this is a considerable change. With the higher resolution model, there are a lot more terrain factors that direct the water compared to the old study that treated an area as flat even if it had a 20' elevation change. The terrain factors that can now be modeled change the inundation area significantly and result in most of the water flowing North and Northeast from Four Corners. This shows water through Belgrade which was previously an island.
	 Mike Rotar provided an update on the Hazard Mitigation Plan. They are currently editing and updating the written plan. Feedback on projects will be solicited electronically in the next couple weeks. On June 27th a work session is being held on wildland urban interface criteria. The plan is to have a final draft ready by fall and begin the state review and local adoption. Following that, the plan would be submitted to FEMA around the end of the calendar year.
