Presentations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Matt Kelley led a discussion on the individual in Gallatin County who was test for Coronavirus last week. The discussion covered the protocols, communications with public and responders, how individuals on the watch list are communicated with, how the response was coordinated, and much more. <p>Overall it went well. The delay in lab results from CDC introduced challenges with precautions for those with potential exposure and speed of communication with the community. The DPHHS is in the process of setting up the ability to conduct tests in Helena, which will shorten the time for results. The spread of inaccurate information on social media was a challenge, especially when combined with the privacy restrictions on what officials can and can't say. The Health Department now has a media tool kit to assist with consistent and frequent information to help provide consistent and authoritative information sources for the community.</p> <p>Capacity was also discussed. The Health Department felt their capacity for monitoring and coordination had a lot more capacity than one potential case created. Bozeman Health indicated that their capacity could easy be exceeded with more cases due to availability of personal protective equipment. The amount of limited PPE for interaction with the patients is also exacerbated when lab results take a long time to come back.</p> <p>There was also a question about the individuals that have been flagged for the watch list and how that information is distributed. It was asked if there was a way to distribute that information easily to</p>

	<p>first responders and maintain confidentiality. Matt wasn't sure how and if that could work, but will work with Patrick and Tim on that.</p> <p>The group also discussed the relative risk from Coronavirus, which is relatively low. The reality is that very few individuals who contract coronavirus are affected critically and way more individuals are critically affected by influenza annually.</p>

He was unsure of the grant amount. Approval by consensus to provide letter of support.
Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patrick provided a quick update on the MCI project. Bus is purchased and waiting for a paint slot at prison. Trailer being configured and distributed. RTF training course is full, may look at a second if there is interest. Ran into an issue with ballistic PPE. Vendor provided quote stating they were undercutting NASPO, which voided NASPO, which meant we were outside of purchasing requirements and had to conduct a sealed bid. Bid package went out to vendors on 2/17 and will be awarded by the end of March. • 2020 Rural Fire Operating Plan was approved on 2/4/2020. • Community Wildfire Protection Plan was preliminarily approved by Gallatin County Commission on 2/4/2020 to allow the US Forest Service to utilize the new modeling in that document in their upcoming projects. The CWPP will be fully adopted in conjunction with the Hazard Mitigation Plan once FEMA finishes the review process on it. • Kevin gave an overview of the Active Killer Full Scale Exercise planned for June 13, 2020. The planning committee is moving ahead with the scenario. • Jason handed out a draft EMS Subcommittee charter and provided an overview on the group's intent. The intent is to provide recommendations on how all areas of Gallatin County could ensure a sustainable medical system. The subcommittee will be setting up a standing meeting date and time that will be provided to AHAD.
