We will plan on working on those at the next AHAD Meeting in June.
	 Patrick advised that group that he is working on setting up a Special Needs Registry for the county. He has been working with 911 to see how this can be integrated into the 911 CAD system. At this point it looks like it is a fairly easy thing to do with minimal overhead. The group had a quite lengthy discussion about the possibilities of this and what options/ criteria could be used. After the 911 CAD upgrade is complete we will schedule this item during an AHAD Meeting and define the scope and procedures.
