Emergency Management	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Patrick advised that Gallatin County has received the award letter from the state for the Middle Creek Early Warning System grant. The award letter is going through the process to be signed by the County Commission. Once it is signed the grant will be ready to go and the process will begin. It is anticipated that the process with the affected communities and response agencies will begin within the next month. It is Patrick's hope that the project can be completed with a single RFP process a turnkey system (engineering, procurement, and installation) through a single vendor. Patrick gave a quick overview of what has been occurring at Hebgen Lake with the intake tower and where that is currently at. Patrick advised that he has been giving functional EOC orientations to various agencies around the county. So far they have been received very well. Orientations are open to any agency, or organization, that is interested. Patrick advised that this year's NIMS reporting was due last Friday. We had some decent numbers from the agency and the system accepted them, so it appears that we are going to be good to go as a county as far as being NIMS Compliant.
Citizen Corps	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Glenn Puffer advised that the CERT course this summer had been cancelled. MSU is going to try and hold one this Fall Semester.
Unified Health Command	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Betty Kalakay gave a brief overview of the Anthrax incident that occurred on the Flying D Ranch. She mentioned that the UHC has been working on their two priorities from the past year; MPI and surge capacity. Bozeman Deaconess Hospital has a new Infectious Disease doctor on staff who attended the last Unified Health Command meeting.
Schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Marilyn King told the group that Bozeman School District was not successful in receiving the preparedness grant this year. Marilyn is going to try and get on the reviewing committee for the next round to learn more about the ranking process, then apply again the following year.
Training & Exercise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kevin Strickler advised that the airport exercise is on track and all the right people seem to be tied in. Patrick advised that there is a free SkyWarn (aka Weather Spotter)

	<p>training course being taught by the National Weather Service at the annual Ham Radio Festival. The SkyWarn class is open to anyone and will be October 11th at 1:00 PM at Sacajawea School.</p>

When the details are known, that information will be distributed.

The State of Montana has inquired on what is being done in the counties and may be able to pay for these. The details are not know what that exactly means. Betty will be contacting the response agencies with more details. • Patrick advised that the October 18th Bomb Class has been cancelled due to lack of signup. If there is enough interest for another date we can reschedule.
