<b>Emergency Management</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Patrick advised that all the paperwork on the Middle Creek Early Warning System is in place. He met with the county finance people and will be working on a draft RFP for the engineering, procurement, and installation of the system.</li> <li>Patrick advised that the state has been re-evaluating the formula on which it distributes Emergency Management Performance Grants to the counties. Based on the decisions made on Wednesday and the expected funding level for FY09, it is very likely that Gallatin County will see an increase in the amount of available grant funds. This available funding would still have to be matched 50/50 by the county.</li> <li>Bryan Connelley asked what the status of the Emergency Operations Center grant which was applied for. Patrick advised that he received notification a couple weeks ago that Gallatin County was not awarded any funding. Montana actually received no awards and all of the awards made went to agencies with large EOC projects already underway.</li> </ul>

Gallatin County has been provided a limited supply of Hepatitis A &amp; B and Tetanus vaccinations available to responders for a \$14 administrative cost. The letter will provide the details on this program.</li> <li>Mutual Aid Discussion – Stephanie Nelson was not present to hold this discussion. Copies of the proposed legislation was handed out.</li> </ul>
