<b>Emergency Management</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Patrick explained to the group that planning money from the state should be available this fall. It appears that Gallatin County will have between around \$40,000. This money is exclusively for planning activities.</li> <li>Patrick advised that everything is moving forward with the Middle Creek Early Warning System. The contractor is scheduled for installation in October pending approval of our Special Use Permit. It sounds like everything is good with the permit and it should be done by the end of the month.</li> <li>Patrick explained to the group that he's been working on EOC upgrades. Most of the upgrades are associated with the backup 911 facility and includes radios, paging transmitters, and network equipment.</li> </ul>

<b>Unified Health Command</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Betty advised that Tim Roark is the interim Health Officer.</li> <li>Betty advised that they are looking at October for H1N1 vaccinations being available, but things keep changing on a regular basis. The Health Department will receive these, then distribute to health care providers.</li> <li>The Health Department needs Fire Responder and Health Care Provider numbers for those agencies that want vaccinations for H1N1 through the Health Department.</li> </ul>
<b>Schools</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Marilyn King advised that they are doing a lot of planning for H1N1. They are working on isolation areas and have formed an advisory committee with a variety of representatives.</li> <li>Glenn advised that they are working on the same H1N1 planning. He advised that MSU has the ability to deliver every class at MSU electronically.</li> <li>Glenn advised that he is still working on CERT.</li> </ul>
