Emergency Management	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Patrick showed the group the planning website being used for the Emergency Management Plan revision (http://www.readygallatin.com/New_Plan.php) . He also covered some of the proposed changes being made as well as a review of the revision process. He encouraged everyone to participate and provide any feedback they may have. Patrick reported that the FY10 homeland security grant requests that were submitted from the county have all made it through with no cuts. The Governor made his final decision on the proposals yesterday and we still had everything. This will now go to DHS and we should have an award around September. Gallatin County also ended up receiving a 50K award to support local incident management training around the state. Patrick reminded everyone that the State's Pre Disaster Mitigation Plan public meeting is coming up in Bozeman and asked if people could attend. This is important because we are not eligible for federal assistance without it and Gallatin County will be updating ours this summer.
