Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have an Elected Official Disaster Workshop scheduled for May 21. This session will consist primarily of an ICS for Executives course and a capstone discussion with Mary Erickson, Forest Supervisor for the Custer Gallatin National Forest. If you have agency executives or elected officials interested in applying, please have them register at eodw.readygallatin.com. The ReadyGallatin.com website has been transitioned to the new site. The new system is a responsive design that works on all types of devices and well as being TLS secured. Senate Bill 5 passed and will take effect July 1. This provides a mechanism for MTDES to incur costs sooner with incident management resources for emerging events.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keith reported that Yellowstone Pipeline has completed the boring under the East Gallatin River near Nelson Road. They are now in the process of switching over to the new pipeline which is significantly farther under the river. Yellowstone Pipeline is still planning a boom deployment exercise, more information to come. In June we will have Montana Rail Link as our presenter on the derailment into the Clarks Fork River.
