| Presentations | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brett Lloyd from Spartan Consulting gave a presentation on the US Department of Agriculture’s response in the Midwest US to Avian Flu in the commercial bird population. It was a good reminder of the unexpected impact, both fiscally and resources, an animal disease outbreak can cause. |
| Action Items | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Patrick provided a handout showing the significant proposed changes to the Emergency Management Plan. No one had any feedback. Patrick asked that any feedback be provided before the end of the year. The Gallatin County Attorney’s Office was unable to get the review on evacuation authorities completed in time for the meeting. Patrick gave a presentation on the proposal provided to the State Emergency Response Commission on created a urban search and rescue capacity here in Montana based on a similar model as the HazMat Teams. Patrick provided an update that a formal request from the Gallatin County Commission was submitted to the State of Montana requesting an Integrated Emergency Management Course for Gallatin County. If approved by FEMA, the course would be delivered sometime in FFY17. |

This project will upgrade the network infrastructure and door locks at the Coordination Center as well as create a backup network link to Butte-Silverbow County. The funding from the Big Sky Resort Tax Board for the Variable Message Sign has been received and the sign arrived |
